## The big picture


As you pursue your degree, you'll gain hands-on experience from work placements at organisations in the public or private sector. This gives you the experience to put what you've learned into practice.

All our courses have a strong international emphasis with opportunities for placements in The Hague, the Netherlands, Europe and overseas. You can tap into THUAS's extensive alumni network and travel to countries like Japan, Argentina and the United States, if permitted.

## Downtime

Becoming a global citizen is all about personal development. This is why we encourage our students to take part in our extracurricular activities, which focus on global and interdisciplinary issues.

## Research

Research is one of the pillars of our university, valuable in building connections with our partners and integral in binding knowledge, professional practice and society in one. Our research groups all deal with relevant and current social issues. To bolster our focus on research, seven Centres of Expertise are being built, which will be composed of various research groups who collaborate on a specific theme. These are long-term in nature and focus on collaboration with external stakeholders. A key part of our approach is to forge strong connections among education, research and professional practice. ## Making connections

During your time at THUAS, you'll be able to make connections with public- and private-sector organisations and to build valuable professional networks in your field of study. These connections are a win-win for everyone: you learn from the experience of seasoned professionals, and they gain from your fresh perspective. It all adds up to theoretical and practical exchanges, which help you develop the professional and personal skills that society needs.

To promote economic and social development and to give you as many opportunities as possible, we work together with other academic institutions, businesses, governments and social organisations. These in turn generate internships, projects, labs, research and more. You have the option to work on local, regional, national or international levels.

A few examples of regional and national partnerships:

- In both education and research, we have developed numerous projects with the municipalities of The Hague, Delft and Zoetermeer, among others.
- At the regional level, we cooperate with organisations such as the Economic Board of South Holland, which brings together businesses, governments and knowledge institutions.
- We have also established partnerships with the ROC Mondriaan, Leiden University and other universities of applied sciences.
- We work with organisations such as the Netherlands Organisation for Applied Scientific Research (TNO), Haga Hospital and NGOs in The Hague region.

## About International partnerships

As a networking university of applied sciences, our priority is to create new synergies and opportunities that accentuate the quality of our education and research. To do this, we've built strong international partnerships with academic institutions outside of Holland, such as Tampere University in Finland, Beijing Foreign Studies University in China and Universidade Federal de Minas Gerais in Brazil. Through these bilateral partnerships, you'll be able to take advantage of student and staff exchanges and share research findings and other knowledge with peers at international institutions. All with the goal of having a positive impact on the world we live in.

### The difference between a university of applied sciences and a research university

There are two types of universities in the Netherlands - traditional research universities (WO) and universities of applied sciences (HBO). Both offer bachelor's and master's programmes, but vary in their teaching methods.

HBO universities, like THUAS, put the emphasis on practical tuition and focus on your future career. You'll learn by working on 'real life' projects in close cooperation with the outside world.

At a HBO university such as THUAS, you will do a compulsory internship or work placement to apply the theory you have learned into practice.

We focus on training and career preparation and work closely with professionals to make sure that our programmes are cutting edge and industry relevant. Businesses and institutions help design our curricula, which means they are hands-on, solution based and market ready. Our lecturers are working professionals, who'll give you first-hand insight into their field.

WO universities tend to run more theory and research-based courses and students attend larger lectures and work independently. HBOs have a more personal approach with smaller classes.

Please note: A THUAS bachelor will not necessarily qualify you for a master at a WO university in the Netherlands - you may need to take additional courses.

At THUAS we offer 45 full-time bachelor's programmes, 11 of which are taught fully in English. Our bachelor's programmes normally take four years to complete. However, some of our programmes can be completed in three years. Please see the admissions requirements to find out which programmes you are eligible for.

All students go on an internship for one semester (half the academic year). The particular arrangements can vary in structure and can entail research or a more practical focus.

At THUAS, all of our bachelor's degrees are based on practical approaches and have an international dimension. Naturally, they also focus on your personal academic and professional development. You'll learn, according to your own style, through a combination of lectures, small seminars, tutorials, self-guided study and individual assignments and exams. You'll round it all off with your thesis.

IP8 enables students to investigate a particular business problem (by doing both secondary and primary research) that the sponsor company seeks to resolve, and to build a strong evidence base for addressing that problem. As such IP8 provides students with the opportunity to actively contribute to decision-making in a real business environment, integrating and culminating the competences acquired throughout the International Business curriculum.</p>

The Hague Summer School (THSS) in Holland offers two editions of a cutting-edge course. Each two-week edition brings together engineers, social scientists, entrepreneurs and human-rights and security specialists – thus professionals from both the public and private sectors – to examine how some of the toughest issues the world is facing can best be tackled.

THUAS encourages its students and faculty alike to pursue transformative change – significant and lasting improvements to the world we live in. There is no better place to investigate and pursue these initiatives than The Hague – International City of Peace and Justice and the political heart of Holland.

The study day during THSS is divided into two: a general module in the morning and electives or projects in the afternoon. You can opt for a two-week course in Block I with Electives or a two-week course in Block II with projects. The full four-week edition is the best option if you would like to get the most out of THSS.

You can choose from among different modules, such as Entrepreneurship, Human Rights, Health Well-Being and Culture or Sustainable Cities. All courses in THSS are in conjunction with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals.

Anyone who has completed at least the first year of a bachelor's degree is eligible to apply. You should have a good working knowledge of English (level B2 or higher).

Upon successful completion of the two-week edition of THSS, you'll earn four European Credit Transfer System points (ECTS), or for the four-week edition, eight points.

# The English Academic Preparation School (PREP School)



# Admission requirements

## Applying for bachelor's programmes

You'll need the equivalent of a Dutch HAVO or VWO diploma to apply for our bachelor's programmes. If you hold a non-Dutch diploma, your eligibility will be assessed against Nuffic guidelines ([www.nuffic.nl](http://www.nuffic.nl)).

Once you have filled out the relevant forms and applied, it's time to sit tight and wait while the admissions committee consider your application. This process can take several weeks.

## What if you don't meet the entry requirements?

Don't worry, there are still alternative ways to help you get in.

### 21+ admissions test

If you're 21 before 1 September 2021 but don't have a diploma or a qualification that meets the entry requirements, you can take the 21+ Admissions Test. To be eligible to participate, you must be a citizen of a EU/EEA country or Switzerland, or already have a valid residence permit for the Netherlands.

## Applying for master's programmes

The entry requirements for our master's programmes vary according to the programme. Applicants must be aged 22 or older and all three of our masters require a minimum of two years of relevant work experience. Masters applicants must have a bachelor degree from a recognised university or academic institution.

## English language requirements

Our international bachelors and master's programmes are taught entirely in English, so you'll need a good command of spoken and written English.

If you're educated in the Netherlands, UK, Ireland, USA, Canada (except Quebec), Australia, New Zealand, South Africa, Malta, or hold a diploma (including English as an exam subject) listed at [www.thehagueuniversity.nl/enrolment](http://www.thehagueuniversity.nl/enrolment), you don't need to take an English proficiency test.

If you are applying for a master's programme and have completed an English-taught bachelor's programme, you may also be exempt from an English proficiency test.

All other applicants are required to have a valid and sufficient English proficiency test.

## Applying for the English Academic Preparation programme

If you don't have the proficiency in English that you need in order to enrol on your chosen programme, you can apply for the English Academic Preparation programme, or Prep School, which takes six months or one year. On completion of this course, you'll be ready to join a bachelors programme and will have a working knowledge of The Netherlands, The Hague and THUAS under your belt.

To be admitted to Prep School, you need to be eligible for the programme you wish to take after completing the course and have an IELTS or TOEFL test result with sufficient score.

The Hague Summer School are open to anyone who has completed a first year bachelor's degree, or already has a bachelors degree. So both undergraduate and graduate students are welcome to apply. You should have a good working knowledge of the English language (level B2 or higher) before you apply.

The last entry criteria to The Hague Summer School is your ambition. When you apply, 'motivation' is one of the most important parts of the selection process.

# Scholarships and finances

EU/EEA and non-EU/EEA students pay tuition fees for bachelor's and master's programmes. So it's time to do the maths and explore the loans, grants and scholarships that may be available to finance your studies at THUAS.

## Bachelor's and master's programmes

EU/EEA bachelor's students pay €2,143 per year and most non-EU/EEA pay €8,375. Tuition fees vary between €16,750 and €20,490 for a masters.

## Other Programmes

The Hague Summer School has a one-off fee which covers all of your main costs including tuition, accommodation, lunches and coffee breaks on class days, study materials and in-programme cultural visits and social activities.

The four-week course costs €3,400 and the two-week course costs €1,750, but discounts may apply. Prep School costs €4,250 for the half-year and €8,250 for the full year course.

## On the cost of living

## Scholarships

International students should check if any scholarships are available in their home country. Your local Dutch embassy and present college or university should be able to help with information and application forms.

## Monthly expenses

You'll also need to take your monthly expenses on accommodation, food and living into account and budget for your time at THUAS.

Experience has shown that students living in the Netherlands for one year spend between €800 and €1100 a month.

An average room in the Netherlands costs somewhere between €400 and €700 a month. The costs depend on the type of room you have, what is included in the rent, if the room is furnished, if you will have to share your room (or the facilities) and the size of the room. Don't forget to budget about €650 per year for medical insurance. Bachelors first year students will also need to invest from €500 to €800 on books and materials.

To give you some approximate figures, bread and rice cost around €1.50 at the supermarket. A return train ticket from The Hague to Amsterdam costs around €24.40.

## Visas and permits

EU and EEA students don't need a visa to enter the Netherlands. All other students in general require an entry visa and/or residence permit.



If you do require a visa or residence permit, the good news is that THUAS will apply on your behalf. All you have to do is transfer a package fee and upload the relevant documents. More information about the procedure and documentation will be provided after acceptance.

## Accommodation

If you pay THUAS's housing fee of €250 you can make use of accommodation that is already reserved through the university. The number of rooms available is limited, and rooms are allocated on a first paid first served basis.

The Hague is the international city of Peace and Justice and home to numerous embassies, multinationals and institutions of higher education. Because of this the housing market is very tight. Looking for a place to live in The Hague or one of its satellite cities can be a challenging experience, so it pays to start house hunting early. Especially for students it can be challenging to find a place to live. And having a legitimate address is a prerequisite for obtaining a residence permit.


